

More formal - No personal pronouns (we, I, us, etc.). Try to write in a more third-person perspective. In the last paragraph, you take a more personal approach. I think what Stephen Julian is looking for is a more disconnected and formal writing style. I would recommend looking at one of the examples on <https://science.howstuffworks.com/>

More streamlined? - You talk about the Turing Machine often in different paragraphs when it doesn't really warrant it. You could merge the two paragraphs talking about on how the Turing Machine works and its relevance to the course. In terms of structure, I would recommend biography, achievements, Turing Machine, relevance so that it flows easily from one topic to the next. (Please take my advice with a grain of salt)

Other than those, I think you're on a good track. Other issues might arise later after you fix some mistakes (which is natural), and I encourage you to come find me or others around you and ask for another peer review.
